A quick write-up of places visited since I last **Updated** this page. Pakistan was a first visit and proved very fruitful. I would not have thought it possible to hold an evangelistic tent meeting within a mile of a Taliban mosque – but I did. As a result some 250 people responded to the call of the Gospel. Many were healed including a man who had been paralysed from the neck down for over 8 years. Even an Imam from the local mosque came and asked for healing prayer. A memorable trip.



Another first visit was to Zimbabwe, This trip saw almost 1,000 people responding to the Gospel call. Again many testified to healing and the most memorable was a girl pushing home the wheel barrow in which she had been brought to the meeting. This trip was saddened and shortened by the death of the pastor's 7 year old son – a victim of the lack of equipment in that sorry land.

A final visit to Kenya to fulfil an outstanding commitment saw me taking six back-to-back two-day 'Unity' seminars. In addition a new pastor's fellowship was initiated in a slum district of Kitale. I had opportunity to say 'Farewell!' to several long standing friends. I am sure that I will visit Kenya again in a few years just for friendships sake.

Finally a three week visit to America, to renew old friendships and make new ones. Also to share the love of Jesus in many places. As always a missions conference in Louisville was a highlight.
